Brief Introduction

Thank you for choosing our Shadow Diffusion Shade Table-top Patio Heater. This instruction manual will provide you with valuable information necessary for the proper care and maintenance of your new product. Please take a few moments to thoroughly read the instructions and familiarise yourself with all the operational aspects of your new heater.

Important Information

WARNING

This heater is not equipped with a device to control the room temperature.

DO NOT use this heater in small rooms when they are occupied by persons not capable of leaving the room on their own, unless constant supervision is provided.

CAUTION

Some parts of this product can become very hot and cause burns. Particular attention has to be given where children and vulnerable people are present.

Please carefully read all instructions provided before using this appliance. This heater must be installed in accordance with the instructions and local regulations.

This Operation Manual contains the important information on your safety, as well as some recommendations on the correct use, installation and maintenance of the appliance.

When operating this infrared heater be sure to observe necessary precautions as improper operation with disregard of these precautions may result in harm to health of the user, other people or objects.

- Unpack the heater making sure that all the items are present and that there are no components left in the box and that the heater head is free from any packing material.
- Using the detailed drawing and follow the steps to assemble your heater.
- **DO NOT** connect the heater to the electrical supply until all the assembly is complete
- **DO NOT** connect the heater to the electrical supply if any of the components or the power cord is damaged in any way

Safety Instructions

Read these instructions before using.

WARNING

Potential fire risk if the heater is covered by any material or positioned close to curtains or other flammable materials.

Only use the heater on a firm solid horizontal area where all the feet on the base are in contact with the floor. (Should the heater be tilted or fall over the auto cut off switch will activate).

When using this electric unit, basic safety precautions should be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, and injury to persons, including the following:

- Site the heater outside or in a large open area and well away from any obstructions such as branches or where the heater is near any objects that can be affected by heat, such as furniture, curtains or other inflammable objects (minimum distance 1 metre).
- **DO NOT** push any items through, obstruct or cover the grill of the heater.
- **DO NOT** position immediately above or below an electrical socket.
- **DO NOT** touch the heater when in use.
- The unit must be placed with the clearance of 100cm to the wall.
- When the power supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by authorised agent or other professional people to avoid danger.
- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- Read **ALL** instructions before using this unit.
- **CAUTION:** Risk of Electric Shock. **DO NOT** open or try to repair the heater yourself.
- This heater may get hot when in use. To avoid burns, **DO NOT** let bare skin touch hot surfaces. If provided, use handles when moving this heater.
- Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, paper, clothes, and curtains at least 3 ft from the front of the heater and keep them away from the sides, top, and rear. **DO NOT** place towels or other objects on the heater.
- Extreme caution is necessary when any heater is used by or near children or vulnerable people, or when the heater is left operating and unattended.
- **DO NOT** operate any heater with a damaged cord or after the heater malfunctions, has been dropped or damaged in any manner. Return heater to authorised service

facility for examination, electrical or mechanical adjustment, or repair.

- This heater is not intended for use in bathrooms, laundry areas and similar indoor locations. **NEVER** locate heater where it may fall into a bathtub or other water container. To protect against electrical hazards, **DO NOT** immerse in water or other liquids.
- **DO NOT** touch the control panel or plug with a wet hand.
- **DO NOT** run cord under carpeting. **DO NOT** cover cord with throw rugs, runners or similar coverings. Arrange cord away from high traffic areas and where it could be a trip hazard.
- **DO NOT** insert or allow foreign objects to enter any ventilation or exhaust opening as this may cause an electric shock or fire, or damage the heater.
- To prevent a possible fire, **DO NOT** block the air intakes or exhaust in any manner. **DO NOT** use on soft surfaces, like a bed, where openings may become blocked.
- A heater has hot and arcing or sparking parts inside. **DO NOT** use in areas where gasoline, paint, explosive and/or flammable liquids are used or stored. Keep unit away from heated surfaces and open flames.
- When connecting the heater to an extension cable, please ensure the extension cable is suitably rated to avoid the appliance overheating and creating a fire hazard. - To avoid fire or shock hazard, plug the unit directly into a 220-240V and 13A electrical socket outlet.
- To disconnect heater, turn controls to **OFF**, then remove plug from outlet. Pull firmly on plug, **DO NOT** unplug by pulling on the cord.
- Always unplug the unit before moving or cleaning, or whenever the heater is not in use.
- Use only for intended household use as described in this manual. Any other use not recommended by the manufacturer may cause fire, electric shock, or injury to persons. The use of attachments not recommended or sold by unauthorised dealers may cause hazards.
- Always use on a dry, level surface.
- **WARNING:** To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, **DO NOT** use this unit with any solid-state speed control device.
- **DO NOT** attempt to repair or adjust any electrical or mechanical functions on this unit. Doing so will void your warranty. The inside of the unit contains no user serviceable parts. Qualified personnel should perform all servicing only.
- Connect to properly grounded outlets only.
- The heater must not be located in front of a socket outlet.

Installation Instructions

Shadow Diffusion Shade Table-top Patio Heater is built with the best quality components in accordance to the prevailing legal regulations and certified for safe in use. For best results from the appliance please ensure that the installation is done by a qualified electrician in accordance with the following instructions and taking full account of current regulations. When using the heater, please carefully follow the instructions and recommendations below.

Connection to 220-240 Volts Power Supply

- It is important to ensure that the electricity supply is of adequate capacity for the electrical load required by the appliance being installed.

Installation Placement

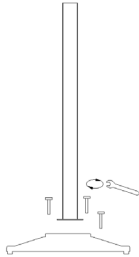
Generally heaters must be placed at a safe distance (clear space) of at least 2.0m from combustible materials and glass walls. If installed in workshops or garages where inflammable or combustible paints are used, the heaters must be installed at a distance of at least 4.0m from the source of danger.

If the heaters are placed in areas where spray painting of any description is taking place, they should not be used during the painting operations.

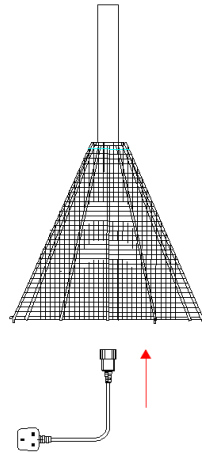
Never use the heater in particularly dusty and explosive areas.

Assembly Instructions

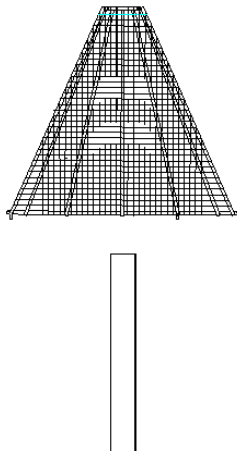
1. Connect the bottom tube to the base with three screws M6*35



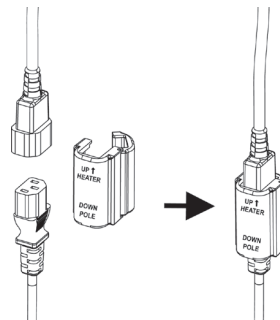
3. Attach the power cord plug through base to the bottom tube.



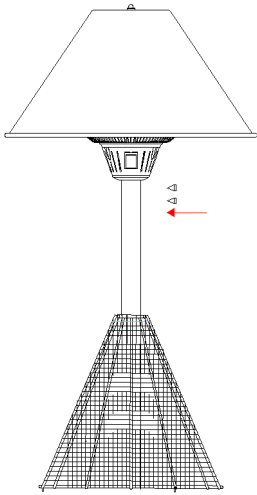
2. Slide decorative cover over tube.



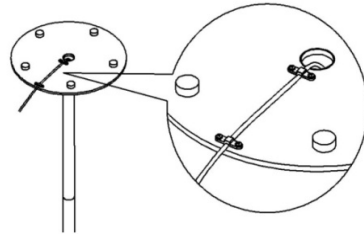
4. Connect the power cord plug to the socket in the heater head.



5. Push the heater head on to the tube and fix it in position using the supplied 2 x M4*8 screws.



6. Pull the power cord gently out of the base as much as possible. Fix the power cord under the weighted base using the supplied 4pcs M4 nuts.



Operation Instructions

Connect the power cable to a 220-240V, 13 amp supply that is located in a safe, dry area.

Touch Control

- Connect the power cable to a 13 amp supply that is located in a safe, dry area.
- The switch on the heater head is used to control the two heat setting. (I) for 1500w. The 0 position is off.
- Although the patio heater is shower proof, do not use when raining or in wet conditions.
- Always disconnect the power cable from the electrical supply, when the patio heater is not in use.

Cleaning & maintenance

Heater housing, grills and internal reflector

- Disconnect the appliance from the power supply system.
- After the appliance has cooled down, the housing can be wiped clean with a damp cloth.
- Do not touch the bulb element with your fingers, since stains could build up from such a contact and may cause malfunction of the blub.
- Do not use any abrasive or hard cleaning products on any part of this heater.
- Do not immerse the appliance in water.
- Wait until the unit is completely dry before use.

Cleaning of heater lamp

- Disconnect the appliance from the power supply system.
- Wipe the lamp over with a damp cloth ensure no detergents or cleaning fluids are used as they may cause damage to the lamp coating.

Storage

If the heater will not be used for a long period of time, store it in a cool, dry location. To prevent dust and dirt build-up, use the original packaging to repack the heater.

Troubleshooting

If the heater will not operate, please check the following before seeking repair of service:

- Check if the power cord is plugged into an electrical outlet, if not, plug in.
- Check if electricity to the main fuse is working.
- Make certain the power switches on the heater are turned on. If not, choose a setting.

Disposal



In accordance with European Directive 2001/96/EG concerning used electrical and electronic appliances (waste electrical and electronic equipment – WEEE), please return any electrical equipment that you will no longer use to the collection points provided for their disposal.
